THIS classic example of 1930s art deco civic architecture is the main building at the Queen Elizabeth II Stadium in Enfield, the new home of Ryman North club Enfield Town.

The listed building has been completely refurbished by Enfield Council while the club have provided a more conventional stand (smaller picture) and a covered terrace at each end.



The club have been seeking a base in their home town since they were formed in 2001 by disaffected supporters of the old Enfield FC. They play there tonight (Monday) against AFC Sudbury in the Alan Boon Cup.

Why is it called the QE II Stadium if it was built in the 1930s? The answer is that construction had to be suspended when war broke out and it was not completed until the 1950s.

ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

FA Cup

REDBRIDGE are the Ryman League's last FA Cup survivors after their battling 0-0 home draw with Southern League leaders Oxford City on Saturday.

East Thurrock gave their all against League Two Macclesfield but conceded the all-important opening goal just before half-time and went down 3-0.

There was heartbreak at the death for Redbridge, who are 18th in Ryman North. Matt Turpin headed home a corner in the dying seconds of added time, only for the celebrations to be halted by the sight of an upraised flag.

Joe Gardner was adjudged to have impeded goalkeeper Keith McCloughlin, although many felt that the situation should have been dealt with before the kick was taken.

Oxford had the upper hand for most of the game but Redbridge defended nobly.

Glen Golby, who left the field with a cut head to leave his side with ten men before that last-gasp corner was taken, was a rock at centre-back and keeper Adam Rafis was outstanding. Oxford came closest when Declan Benjamin hit a post just before half-time.

It cannot have been very often, incidentally, that a team has played Cambridge City and Oxford City in successive weeks when both Oxbridge sides were, at the time, on top of the same league. Redbridge had won 2-1 at Cambridge, then the leaders, in the FA Trophy a week earlier and Oxford had taken over at the top in midweek.

Sundays' draw offered Redbridge a trip to Football League newcomers Crawley as the reward for a replay victory. The last team to beat Crawley in the FA Cup were Manchester United.

East Thurrock dominated the first half against their Football League opponents but could not get the goal which could have made all the difference.

Reiss Gilbey was unlucky with an effort that was just too high and Sam Higgins was foiled by Portuguese keeper Jose Veiga.

Macclesfield grabbed an undeserved lead two minutes before the interval when Carl Tremarco fired home from the edge of the box.

Veiga denied Greg Cohen early in the second half but the visitors were having more of the game and Matt Hamshaw doubled their lead in the 62nd minute, heading home after Ross Draper's shot came back off the bar.

Sam Collins immediately brought a full-stretch save from Veiga but the Silkmen killed the tie in the 65th minute when George Donnelly's shot was blocked and he lashed in the rebound.

The crowd of 1,207 at Rookery Hill was eight short of the record set when Woking visited for a fourth qualifying round tie in 2003.

SOME smart electrical work kept Billericay at the top of the table on Saturday. A floodlight failure at half-time threatened to bring a premature end to their home game with Wealdstone, but the problem was solved just in time and the point from a 0-0 draw was enough to keep Craig Edwards' team at the top.

It was a far better game than the scoreline suggests: Billericay had more of the play but Stones hit the bar twice, a Richard Jolly header and a dipping shot by David Hicks.

Hornchurch trail Billericay by a single goal after a late comeback gave them a 2-1 victory at Concord, their seventh away win of the season. A 35th-minute penalty by Anthony Stokes gave Concord a half-time lead but Urchins, despite having defenders Rickie Hayles and Elliot Styles taken to hospital, drew level through Frankie Curley in the 76th minute and won it with a Lewis Smith strike three minutes later.

Lowestoft are back in third place after a 22nd-minute free-kick by Scott Mitchell was enough for three points at Aveley, who had Spencer Harrison sent off early in the second half.

The quickest dismissal of the day came at Margate, where just five minutes were on the clock when Wingate keeper Bobby Smith was given his marching orders for bringing down Duane Jackman. Kwesi Appiah converted the resultant penalty and went on to blast a second-half hat-trick, taking his league and cup tally to 21. Dan Stubbs was the other scorer, midway through the first half, and Wingate finished with nine men after Tony Burke was shown a second yellow card. Floodlight trouble also hit this game, causing a delay soon after the interval.

Margate were the only side in the division to score more than twice, though both sides managed two goals at Tooting where Horsham's draw lifted them off the foot of the table. Charlie Stimson gave Tooting an 18th-minute lead but Horsham replied with two goals in six minutes, from Tony Nwachukwu and Tommy Youle, to take the lead before the interval. They held it until two minutes

from time, when Wade Small grabbed a point for the hosts.

Leatherhead are back on the bottom after their 2-0 defeat at Harrow. Evandro Delgado opened the scoring after 23 minutes and, although the visitors were on top for long spells, Reggie Savage made sure with nine minutes left.

Cray also won 2-0, at Hastings, to move into fifth place, leading a group of three teams who are four points off the pace. Lewis Perkins gave them the lead just after the half-hour but they had to wait until added time for Jack Clark's clincher. It was the first win in nine games for Cray and ended a run of four successive Hastings victories.

Just behind Cray are Hendon, for whom Isaiah Rankin's goal three minutes after the interval was enough for a home win over Canvey. Hendon gave debuts to Frank Sinclair and Darren Currie, two players with over 1,000 Football League games between them.

Completing the group of three are Lewes, who were held to a 1-1 home draw by Bury. Ian Draycott's 20th-minute goal for the Rooks was answered by Kieran Leabon just before half-time and Bury held on to the point even though they had Daniel Cunningham sent off.

Carshalton were 3-2 winners at Kingstonian in a thrilling game on Sunday. It was their sixth victory in the league this season and all but one of them have been away from home.

Laurent Hamici gave them a 13th-minute lead to which K's replied in the 35th minute when Gary McDonald found the net after Bobby Traynor's shot came back off the bar.

Hamici finished off a good move in the 53rd minute and again McDonald hit back, this time within four minutes. Paul Vines put the Robins ahead for the third time in the 65th minute and this time they held it, although they had to clear a Mo Harkin shot off their line.



THERE were two action-packed matches on Saturday, the pick of them at Potters Bar where Maldon were beaten 4-3 in a remarkable finish.

Tom Pett scored for the hosts after four minutes and Paul Shave replied nine minutes before the break. The hosts regained the lead when Anton Agdomar struck in the 57th minute, only for Ashley Harrison-Barker to make it 2-2 with a 78th-minute own goal. When Pett got his second in the 89th minute it was surely all over, but Maldon had other ideas and Kevin McLeod netted their third equaliser a minute into added time. Back came the Scholars and Harrison-Barker atoned for his earlier mishap by setting up the winner for James Gershfield.

The finish was not quite so dramatic at Waltham Forest, but it was certainly an eventful affair as Romford battled out a 4-4 draw. Jack Barry gave

Romford the lead with just 38 seconds on the clock and Kurt Smith made it 2-0 after 15 minutes. Manu Dagher pulled one back before half-time but Nick Reynolds netted Romford's third 11 minutes after the break. A penalty converted by Josh Bonnett on 65 minutes gave Forest new hope and nine minutes later they were in front thanks to a Jeff Hammond double. Reynolds levelled matters again two minutes later and Paul Kavanagh's missed penalty soon afterwards denied Romford all three points.

The third home team to score four times were leaders Needham Market, but they did so without reply as they saw off Thamesmead. The biggest surprise was that the league's top scorer Sam Newson failed in his bid to find the net for the tenth successive match. Duane Wright headed the opener on 34 minutes, Danny Bloomfield made it 2-0 before the interval and Wright scored again in the 58th minute, leaving Dan Thrower to complete the scoring in added time.

Needham's club captain Rhys Barber was presented with a trophy before the game by chairman David Bugg to commemorate his 300th appearance for the Marketmen a week earlier (pictured above).

Leiston made it a Suffolk 1-2 at the top as they edged out Brentwood 2-1 in a match between sides who started the day in third and fourth places. After a goalless first half, Dean Green put the visitors ahead in the 49th minute. Michael Brothers replied for Leiston just after the hour and Leon Ottley-Gooch got the winner with a deflected shot ten minutes later.

Enfield Town moved into fourth place with a 2-1 win at Sudbury. Leon Osei gave them a 13th-minute lead, after which Sudbury's Rhys Darg was involved in the most significant action. He conceded the penalty which Liam Hope converted to double the lead on 25 minutes, then hit the bar and finally won a penalty himself. James Baker scored, but by then there were only six minutes left and Enfield held out. The teams meet again tomorrow (Monday) in the Alan Boon Cup at Enfield's new home, the Queen Elizabeth II Stadium.

There were two penalties at Heybridge, too. They came in quick succession in the 75th and 77th minutes and were both converted by Jack West as the hosts wiped out the lead Liam Hopkins had given Great Wakering in the 32nd minute. They were West's first goals since his move from Tilbury and took his league tally into double figures. A late Stuart Fergus free-kick made it 3-1 to Swifts.

The fourth game in the division to produce two spot-kicks was at Cheshunt, where bottom club Ilford drew 2-2 to collect their first away point of the season. It was almost three, but Charlie Moxom equalised for Cheshunt four minutes into added time. It had been Moxom who handled in the third minute, allowing Stephen Opoka to give Ilford the lead with his first penalty. Anthony McDonald levelled on the hour with a 30-yard drive but Opoka responded with two minutes. Cheshunt then had

Dan Roles sent off when he conceded another penalty, but this time Opoka shot over the bar and the ten men made the most of their reprieve.

Ware remained a point ahead of Ilford with a 2-2 draw of their own, at home to Chatham who went in front with a 14th-minute header by Lloyd Blackman. Aime Blessing levelled it four minutes after the break and Tony Martin put Ware ahead just after the hour, only for Lee Hales to square it again with a penalty nine minutes later.

Two goals by Piers Wixon earned Harlow a 3-1 win at Waltham Abbey. Lee Marshall fired Harlow ahead a minute before the break and Ayrton Coley headed the equaliser two minutes into the second half.

Wixon restored Hawks' lead when he forced the ball home at the second attempt in the 70th minute and he nodded his second with five minutes left.

Grays reclaimed second place on Sunday, though they made harder work of their home win over Soham than the 4-1 scoreline indicates.

Soham had to play with ten men from the eighth minute when Dubi Ogbonna was sent off after clashing with Grant Cooper, who was booked. Ogbonna had already brought a top-class save from home keeper Ally Aksoy.

The depleted visitors took the lead in the 16th minute with a Matt Robinson penalty and might have gone further ahead when Dan Cotton rounded Aksoy but shot wide.

Grays skipper Lee Flynn drilled home a low free-kick from 20 yards to equalise in the 32nd minute and he repeated the trick, this time from open play, to put his side ahead on the hour.

Soham keeper Daniel Bircham pulled off several outstanding saves as his teammates tired, but he could not prevent Grays adding two late goals.

Boreham Wood loanee Leon McKenzie set up the third for Danny Bunce, who then returned the favour to provide the fourth for McKenzie.



WORTHING emphasised their promotion credentials with a 1-0 home win over second-placed Dulwich Hamlet on Saturday.

The crucial goal came from Ryan McBride in the 25th minute when he headed home the rebound after James Tedder had saved from Tom Lawley.

Worthing are only seventh in the table but they have at least three games in hand over all the teams above them.

Dulwich stay second because Bognor were held to a 2-2 draw at Folkestone. Jason Prior gave the visitors a sixth-minute lead which they held until soon after the hour mark, when Simon Austin headed the equaliser.

Austin then fired the Kent side in front with 12 minutes left, only for Prior to respond with a header, his 16th league goal of the season. A superb save in added time by Craig Stoner denied Austin his hat-trick.

Chief beneficiaries of these two results were leaders Maidstone, who are five points clear after extending their unbeaten league run to 13 games, 12 of them won. Their latest victims were Ramsgate, who went down 4-1 at Central Park.

Ellis Green gave Stones an early lead which was erased by Ian Pulman in the 18th minute. Within ten minutes, however, Stones were 3-1 up through Shaun Welford, his 20th of the season in league and cup, and Alex Flisher.

Alex Waugh added the fourth 13 minutes into the second half and Ramsgate's misery was complete when Liam Quinn received his second booking near the end.

Whitehawk moved above Folkestone into fourth place thanks to a second-minute goal by James Fraser.

More should have followed, but Hawks could not find the net again and visiting Hythe might well have snatched a point.

Lowly Whyteleafe scored twice in the last three minutes amid much controversy to grab a 2-2 home draw with Sittingbourne.

The visitors looked comfortable after Hicham Akhazzan gave them the lead on the hour and Joe Goldsmith added a second from the spot.

The flashpoint came in the 88th minute when Leafe attempted to return the ball to the Brickies keeper after an injury.

It struck a defender and play was allowed to continue, leading to a corner from which Danny Dudley scored from close range. The visitors were still fuming when Stephane Gnamore equalised.

The bottom five clubs at the start of play, including Whyteleafe, all escaped defeat.

Table-propping Crawley Down drew 0-0 at home to sixth-placed Corinthian-Casuals, the village club's first draw in Ryman League football.

It was more eventful at 21st-placed Burgess Hill, who drew 3-3 with Eastbourne. The visitors looked well on their way to victory when Dean Brooks and Sam Crabb scored in the first 15 minutes.

Lloyd Cotton reduced the arrears shortly before the interval but Richard Greenfield's 55th-minute strike put Eastbourne back in control.

Jon Melia's header with 15 minutes left gave Hillians new hope and it was Melia who scrambled the equaliser five minutes later.

Both Walton clubs moved out of the bottom five with victories. It was the first time the neighbours had won on the same day since March 19.

Walton & Hersham came out on top by the odd goal in five at Croydon Athletic, who dropped into the bottom four.

Michael Gordon gave the Swans a lead they would never lose after 18 minutes and set up the second for Matt Pattison moments after half-time. George Landais pulled one back and he scored again with ten minutes left, but not until after Phil Williams had scored Walton's third.

Two goals in the first five minutes by former Swan Glenn Stanley, his first since moving across town, earned Walton Casuals a 2-0 home win over Merstham, who had Dean Hamlin sent off on the hour.

Chipstead continued their good start to the season with a 4-1 home win over Whitstable. After a scoreless first half, Marcus Elliott made the breakthrough in the 54th minute and Martin Grant added another 12 minutes later. John Paul Collier gave the visitors hope with ten minutes left but a Wayne Grizzle header and a Callum O'Shea free-kick settled it.

A 12th-minute goal by Tom Hickman gave Faversham the points at Godalming, who had Adam Foulser sent off with five minutes left.

The ten men then won a penalty, but Rob French capped his excellent afternoon's work by saving Gavin Smith's kick.

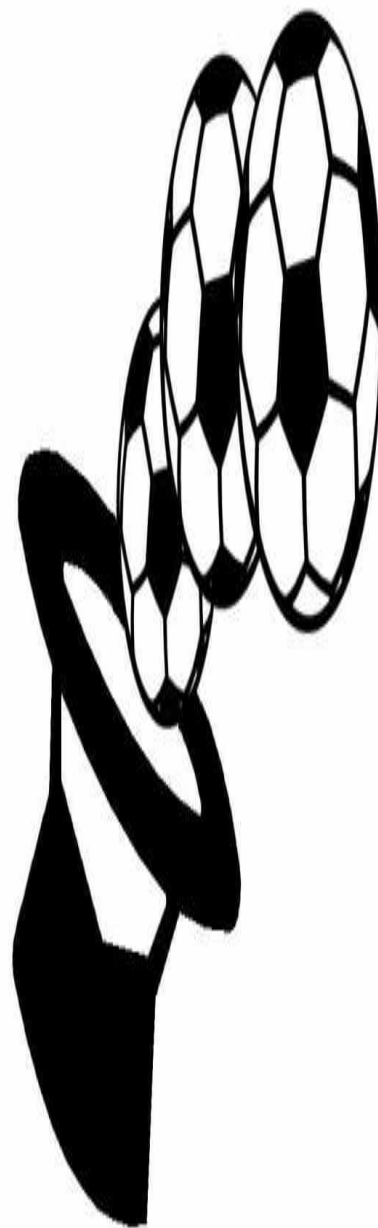

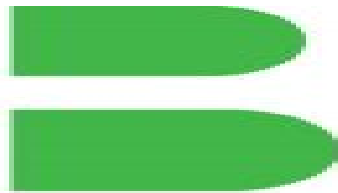
